Visiting artist installs work exploring natural structures at GP Museum of Art

Jenni Ward of Santa Cruz, California gets to every one of her art

They're installations, after all. She has to be there to put it all together.

This week Ward's at the Grants Pass Museum of Art installing seven installation areas that all flow together on the theme "Where Art and Nature Meet." She'll speak briefly and take questions tonight during First Friday Live from 5 to 9 p.m.

"It's actually my favorite part, the fun of the unknown," she says while pushing hundreds of ceramic pieces into a wall to form a structure similar to the droppings of mushroom spore. The pieces are designed on the structure of shelf fungi.

She tends to make hundreds of individual things that all go together later, she says. So the making part of the art is a bit dull. Putting it all together in a fresh space is where it's at.

Ward's pieces are more typically assembled outdoors, then documented. They all explore the structures of the natural world, "then abstracting and reconstructing those structures — that's what inter-

But she had been to the museum before. "I love the brick walls and all of the great light," she says. "This has been in the works for about a year.

She had all the dimensions of the walls and spaces on a map and planned the installation accordingly.
